The Farm

Farm and garden water is supplied from the bore, but mainly from the 'The Billabong'; a picturesque Willow studded water feature. This

estate is being offered with all equipment to run a small farm; basically WIWO. Ferguson tractor and slasher, mower and a John Deere six wheel all-terrain vehicle; equipment and tools too much to mention here.

The Home

On site is a magnificent homestead of four bedrooms, three bathrooms, two family rooms, spacious modern kitchen, reverse cycle air-con and combustion heating. 3 car garaging. Approach is via circular drive and spacious portico. In the immediate home precinct are manicured lawns and gardens and antique feature pieces of farm items. Set in a position to take in the outlook is the magnificent heated 'rock pool' for relaxation. House water is caught and stored in an underground tank of 30,000 litres.

The River

The beautiful Macdonald River... At the sweeping bend up against sheer cliffs there is parklike frontage with sandy beach for water sports, swimming, boating. Like fishing? They're all here; Bream, Flathead, Perch, Mulloway. Take your 'tin boat' down to the Hawkesbury if you like. There is a 4 knot limit here.

The History

The river is quite navigable and as so, in the old days, river boats passed here en route to St Albans and beyond for produce and supplies. The road North passed through this property via the infamous Book's Ferry which was oft subject to accident, stranding at low tide and the occasional sinking. It was replaced by a bridge ultimately. This wasn't well thought out or constructed as not long after it was built, it was swept away in the great flood of 1949. Remnants of the bridge can still be seen.

As one emerged from the ferry and later the bridge, on the hill above was the ruin of St Joseph's Church and just below was Whalen's Inn; a basic structure but a good stop for many a traveller. The homestead is now located on the original

Whalen's Inn site.

Go forward 150 years or so and overlay all that onto the "Wonga Point" of today.

Summary
